



Be God's Hands this Lent with Catholic Charities!

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2). Lent is a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. What is almsgiving? Almsgiving is the act of donating money or goods to the poor or performing other acts of charity. The giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents.

This Lenten season, consider choosing Catholic Charities as your charity for almsgiving. Our mission is "We are Gods' hands providing housing, health, and hope to His children." To learn more about our services and programs visit ccdok.org. Here are a few ways you can be God's hands and share your gifts:

SACRIFICE JAR – choose any vessel and place your dollars and cents in the jar each time you make a sacrifice (giving up a fancy coffee, a dinner out, completing a chore for someone, etc.). Gather up your sacrifice jar collection and donate to Catholic Charities. Look at what your small sacrifices could do for someone in need:

- Just \$10 could provide up to 5 boxes of food to families in need
- Just \$25 can provide a box of diapers to a young mother
- Just \$100 can pay for meals for homeless youth at the Ark Shelter for 2 days

Imagine if all 100,000 Catholics in our Diocese saved just \$10 in their sacrifice jar for Lent....just the cost of a few cups of coffee or pizza....the effect would be life changing for so many in need!

DONATE – gently used toys and books and baby clothes to Caring Network. We will provide our pregnant and parenting moms and babies with these much needed material items!

Supporting Our Mission

Caring Network is the Diocese of Kalamazoo's Pro-Life Agency, helping women feel supported, cared for, championed as they choose life for their babies. We couldn't do the work we do without the support of every single person, family, parish, school, business and volunteer that says "yes, I'm going to help make a difference for the women you serve." One such example of this support came from Battle Creek's Tri-Parish Pro-Life Ministry Spiritual Adoption (St. Philip, St. Joseph, and St. Jerome Parishes) that had over 175 people sign up to spiritually adopt babies at the three parishes. Cathy Hirzel, Tri-Parish Pro Life member, explains the Spiritual Adoption begins at the Annunciation and concludes with a "baby shower" in January. "Participants sign up by choosing and writing their name on a heart with a baby's name and this information is displayed on a trifold board at each parish. Daily prayers

are said for the parents and baby, and physical and monetary donations are donated in January", says Cathy. The Tri-Parishes collected \$1860 for Caring Network and filled the Caring Closet with needed material items for the families we serve.
